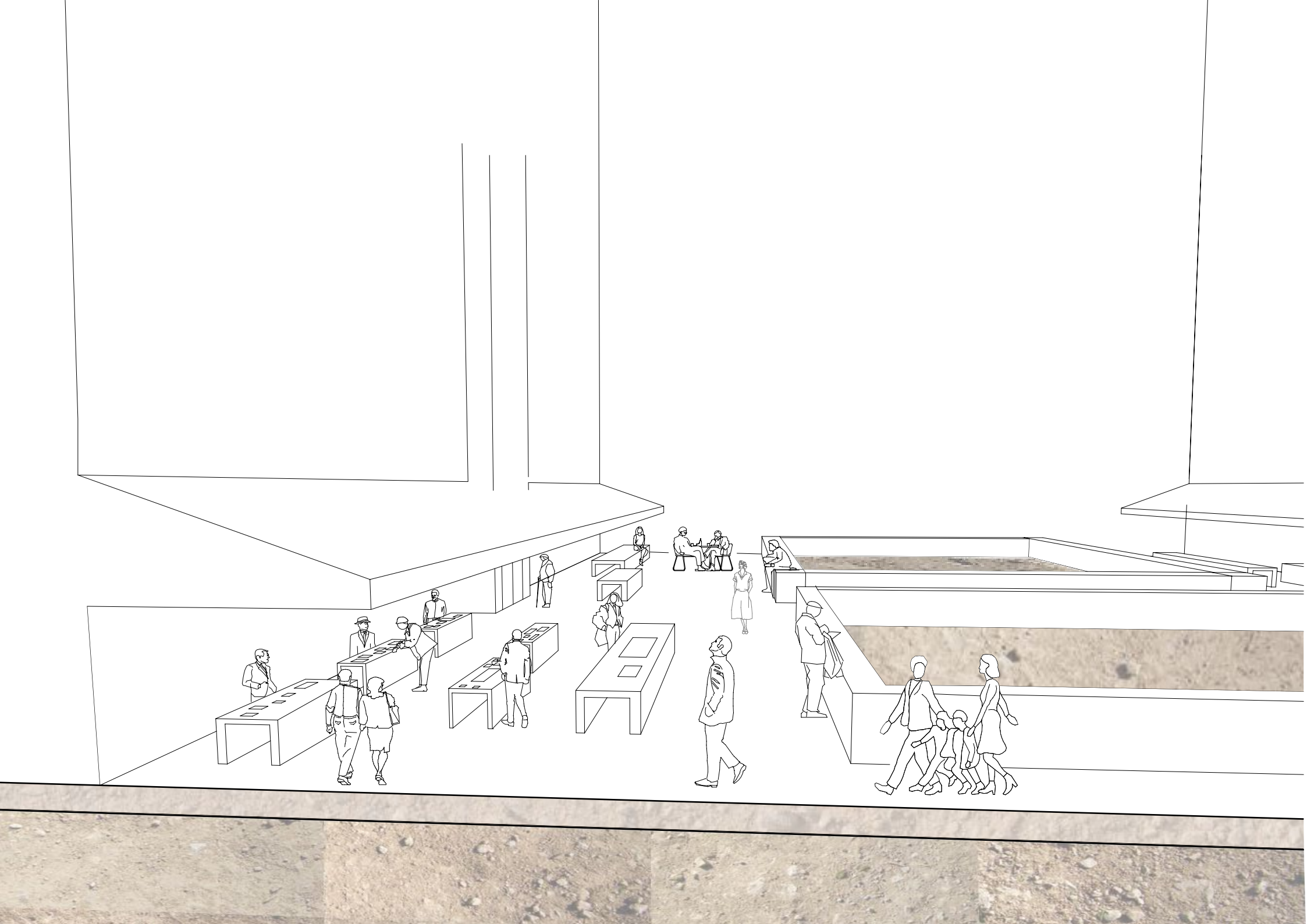


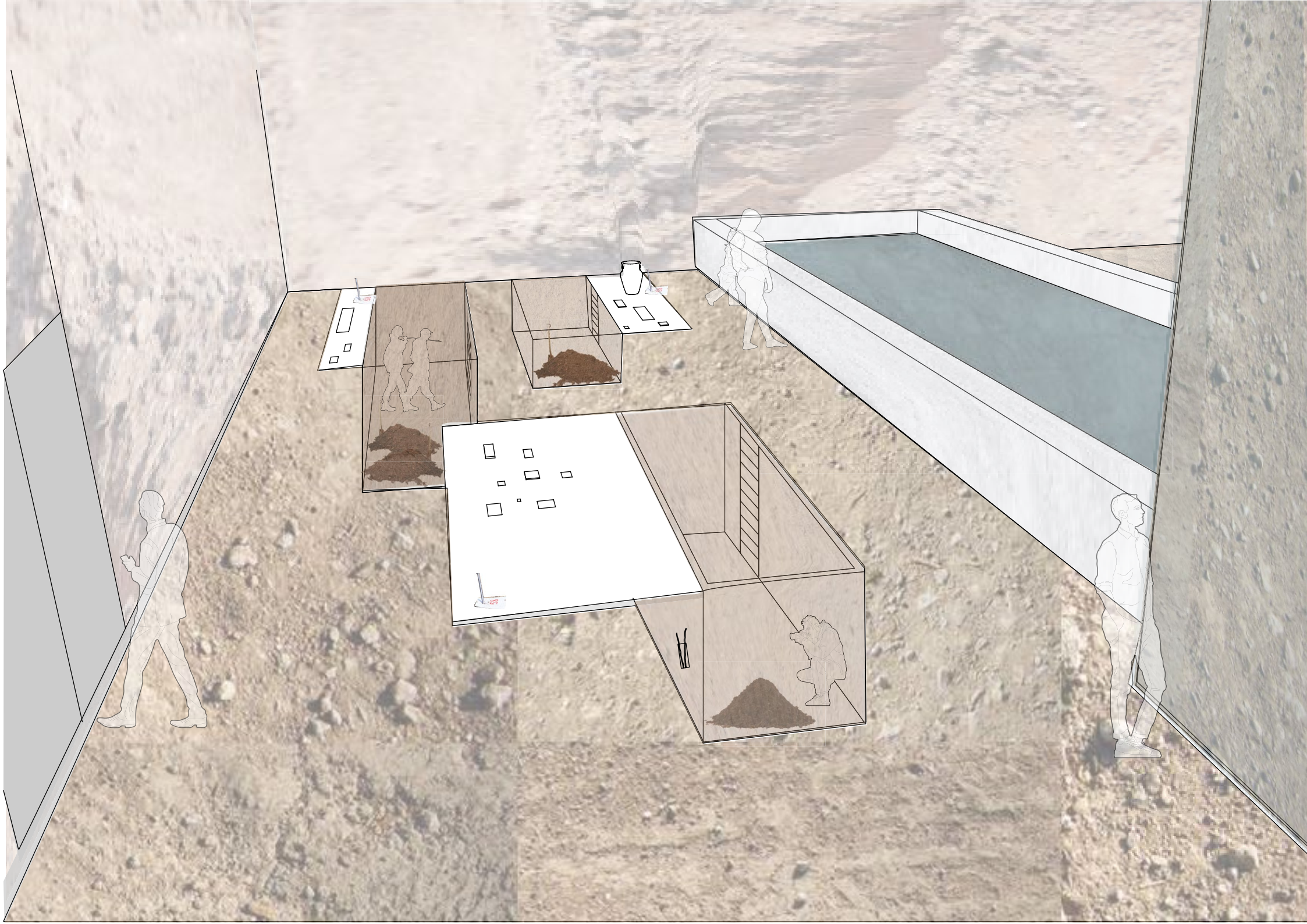
Markthal as a home for Archaeology in the city of Rotterdam

A reintegration of the underground into public discourse, allowing people to input into how underground urban spaces are shaped, imagined, experienced and used

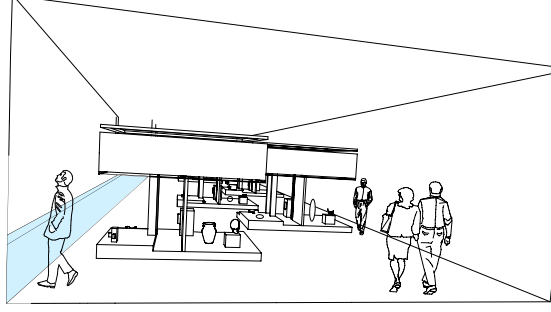




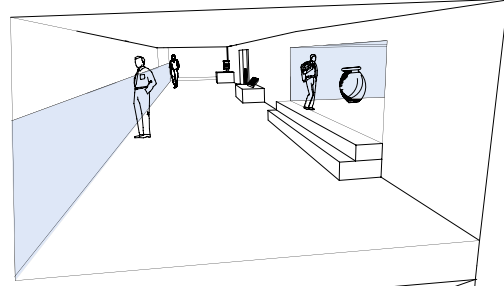




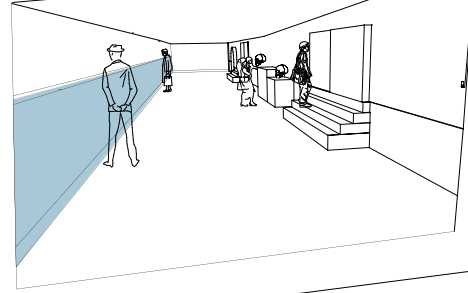
